Scheduling for the Upcoming School Year -

The last day of school for our students is Friday, June 17, and the first day of school for the 2016-2017 school year is August 24. Through a three-year waiver applied for and granted by the Michigan Department of Education, all Jackson County Schools will be utilizing the same schedule that includes 180 days of instruction, which allows everyone to begin school in advance of Labor Day. While Grass Lake has scheduled 180 days of instruction for several years, 180 has become a requirement for all Michigan schools, effective this coming school year.
